KS1

**Key forms:** To Entertain, To Discuss, To Persuade, To Inform

**Examples of writing carried out by pupils:**

**To Entertain:** fairy tales, story beginnings, character descriptions, poetry, playscripts

**To Discuss:** leaflet, book reviews, explanation

**To Persuade:** letters, arguments

**To Inform:** postcards, instructions, newspaper reports

**Types of hooks to stimulate and generate:**

Planning application (local), fairy letters, rich texts for fiction and non-fiction, baking, craft

KS2

**Key forms:** To Entertain, To Discuss, To Persuade, To Inform

**Examples of writing carried out by pupils:**

**To Entertain:** adventure stories, poetry, playscripts, film reviews, flashbacks, characterisation

**To Discuss:** film reviews, Trip Advisor reviews, explanation

**To Persuade:** letters (formal and informal), adverts

**To Inform:** newspaper reports, non-chronological recounts, biographies

**Types of hooks to stimulate and generate:**

Dragon's Den, Bake Off, Finding a dinosaur egg, use of film and music
